Rosie Evans is trying to find a larger venue, as again our numbers at the meeting were larger than our present venue can accommodate.

Tony Cabban will be our guest speaker for February.

Russell Thompson the British Consulate will be our Guest Speaker at the April meeting. He is prepared to answer questions of a non-political nature, if any questions are concerning the LRAU he will answer them after the meeting.

Rosie Evans: Vice President explained that we are still battling away at getting our Constitutional Statutes. She has again visited Alicante only to find that the one person she needed to speak to was unavailable. Until all our statutes are in place we are not able to pay, cheques made out to the U3A into the bank. Rosie has now accepted the role of Liaison Officer to the Javea U3A, she visited Denia U3A meeting and out of 130 attending the meeting 70 of them parted with their joining fee that day. We will keep in touch with them to consider joint outings etc. Mike Frost and Rosie will also attend Calpe meeting to see if we can come up with future ideas to help our club, but we also need lots of ideas from the members here in Javea.

The meeting closed at 12.30pm



### March 29<sup>th</sup> 2006 – Questions for Jávea Mayor

- 1. Could the mayor give a personal overview of himself, such as marital status, education, experience in local government etc.
- 2. What are his objectives over the next 12 months and could he briefly explain what his job entails?
- 3. Bearing in mind that 52% of the population of Jávea are non-Spanish, how important does the mayor consider it to be to have non-Spanish representation on the Council?
- 4. With the ever-increasing number of homes being built in Jávea, are there any plans in place to improve the infrastructure i.e. fire brigade, a hospital here?
- 5. There seems to be a very high volume of burglaries in Jávea and the surrounding area what action is being taken to curtail this?
- 6. Once the surrounding buildings are complete, are there any plans in place for the construction of a proper roundabout by Barclays Bank?
- 7. Could he update us on the situation regarding the proposals to build car parking in the port below the Avd Rey Jaime 1, and the underground car park at the Thursday market area. (Many questions were repeated, especially about parking and building)?
- 8. Would it be possible to have Resident Parking Permits?
- 9. Jávea Park in particular is very run down and dirty, especially behind the shops towards the Arenal. Very little money seems to go on the general upkeep of the town are there any plans to rectify the situation?
- 10. What is the latest position over the indoor swimming pool that has been talked about for so long?
- 11. The newspapers have reported that the council have purchased a municipal tow truck. When will it arrive, and will there be sufficient police to control equally those vehicles which are parked illegally on yellow lines as well as those which are parked where there is a sign clearly prohibiting parking, and those residents who have special parking places allocated to them?
- 12. Could the mayor explain the changes that are going to take place in the pueblo of Jávea next year, and also the changes in the catastral for Jávea?
- 13. Some years ago, Jávea had a thriving cricket club and the local pitch was taken by the council for development, and alternative accommodation promised. When will that promise be met? (Jávea Cricket Club were Spanish champions!)
- 14. How accurate is the report that the Town Hall has inherited over 600000 euros of unpaid invoices from the 2005 administration headed by Snr Juan Moragues? How is the Town Hall dealing with this deficit and what affect will it have on the Town Hall budget for 2006?
